Radiologic Technology Program (RGT) is a 2-year degree program designed to prepare students for entry-level positions in the field of radiology. Through six consecutive semesters of academic, laboratory and clinical training, students acquire knowledge and hands on experience to be an integral part of a dynamic healthcare team. General education and radiography courses are taught on campus with clinical experiences provided in local and out-of-town radiology centers. This program will not prepare students that are interested in a career pertaining to ultrasound.
